The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Forest and Rural Fires Amendment Act 2000.
- (2) In this Act, the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1977 is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

3 Interpretation

Section 2(1) of the principal Act is amended by adding the following subparagraphs to paragraph (c) of the definition of State area:

- (viii) any easement acquired and held for conservation purposes under section 7(2) of the Conservation Act 1987:
- (ix) any right of way or other easement acquired for the purposes of section 12 of the Reserves Act 1977 and held for those purposes under that Act.
