Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 2006, substitute a new scale of fees in respect of various matters under the Private Investigators and Security Guards Act 1974. Most of the fees are reduced except for the fee for the renewal of a certificate of approval, which is increased from \$50 to \$60. The regulations also remove the fee for inspection of registers.
