**Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These rules, which come into force on 1 August 2012, amend rule 7(1)(b) of the New Zealand Teachers Council (Conduct) Rules 2004. The amendment increases from 12 to 20 the maximum number of people who, not being members of the New Zealand Teachers Council, may serve on the Complaints Assessment Committee.
