The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Casino Control (Moratorium Extension) Amendment Act 2000.
- (2) In this Act, the Casino Control Act 1990 is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

3 Moratorium on considering applications received between 16 October 1997 and 15 October 2000

- (1) Section 27A(1) of the principal Act is amended by—
 - (a) omitting the expression “3-year”;
 - (b) omitting the expression “2000”, and substituting the expression “2003”.

- (2) Section 27A(3)(b) of the principal Act is amended by omitting the expression “2000”, and substituting the expression “2003”.
- (3) Section 27A of the principal Act is amended by repealing subsection (4), and substituting the following subsection:
“(4) No compensation is payable by the Crown to any person for any loss resulting from the moratorium imposed by this section.”
- (4) The heading to section 27A of the principal Act is amended by omitting the expression “2000”, and substituting the expression “2003”.

4 Expiry of provisions

Section 27B of the principal Act is amended by omitting the expression “2000”, and substituting the expression “2003”.

5 Repeal of Act

This Act is repealed on 16 October 2003.
