Pursuant to section 100 of the Civil Aviation Act 1990, Her Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

Changes authorised by subpart 2 of Part 2 of the Legislation Act 2012 have been made in this official reprint.  
Note 4 at the end of this reprint provides a list of the amendments incorporated.

**These regulations are administered by the Ministry of Transport.**

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## Regulations

### 1 Title

These regulations are the Civil Aviation (Offences) Regulations 2006.

### 2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 1 August 2006.

### 3 Interpretation

- (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

**Act** means the Civil Aviation Act 1990

**Civil Aviation Rules** or **rules** means the ordinary rules made under Part 3 of the Act

**provision** means a provision of the Civil Aviation Rules.

- (2) Every reference in these regulations to any provision includes every provision for the time being in force amending or made in substitution for that provision.
- (3) The brief descriptions given in the second column of Schedule 1 are intended to be only an indication of the content of the provisions they describe, and are not intended to be used in the interpretation of the provisions.
- (4) Abbreviations used in the second column of Schedule 1 have the meanings given to those abbreviations in the rules.

### 4 Offences and penalties

- (1) A breach of a provision specified in the first column of Schedule 1 is an offence against the Act.
- (2) A person who commits an offence referred to in subclause (1) is liable on conviction,—
- (a) in the case of an individual, to a fine not exceeding the amount specified in relation to that offence in the third column of Schedule 1:
  - (b) in the case of a body corporate, to a fine not exceeding the amount specified in relation to that offence in the fourth column of Schedule 1.

## **5 Infringement offences**

- (1) A breach of a provision specified in the first column of Schedule 1 for which an infringement fee is specified in Schedule 1 is an infringement offence against the Act.
- (2) The infringement fee for an offence referred to in subclause (1) is,—
  - (a) in the case of an individual, the infringement fee specified in relation to that offence in the fifth column of Schedule 1;
  - (b) in the case of a body corporate, the infringement fee specified in relation to that offence in the sixth column of Schedule 1.

## **6 Infringement notices**

Every infringement notice under—

- (a) section 58 of the Act must be in the form set out in Schedule 2; and
- (b) section 65P of the Act must be in the form set out in Schedule 3.

## **7 Form of pilot-in-command request and undertaking**

- (1) Every request by a pilot-in-command for an infringement notice to be issued to, or for proceedings to be commenced against, an unruly passenger under section 65D(1)(a)(i) of the Act must be in the form set out in Schedule 4.
- (2) Every undertaking by a pilot-in-command under section 65D(1)(a)(ii) of the Act must be in the form set out in Schedule 4.

## **8 Revocation**

The Civil Aviation (Offences) Regulations 1997 (SR 1997/56) are revoked.

#### *Payments*

- 2 If you pay the infringement fee for an alleged offence within 28 days of the service on you of this notice, no further enforcement action will be taken for that offence. Payments may be made at places indicated on the front page of this notice.

#### *Defence*

- 3 You have a complete defence against proceedings for an alleged offence if the infringement fee for that offence has been paid to the enforcement authority at the address shown on the front page of this notice within 28 days after service on you of a reminder notice. Late payment or payment made to any other address will not constitute a defence.

#### *Further action*

- 4 If you wish to—
- (a) raise any matter relating to the circumstances of an alleged offence for consideration by the enforcement authority; or
  - (b) deny liability for the offence and request a court hearing; or
  - (c) admit liability for the offence, but wish to have a court consider written submissions as to penalty or otherwise—

you should write to the enforcement authority at the address shown on the front page of this notice. Any such letter should be personally signed.

- 5 If you deny liability for the offence and request a hearing, the enforcement authority will, unless it decides not to commence court proceedings in respect of the offence, serve you with a notice of hearing setting out the place and time at which the matter will be heard by the court.

**Note:** If the court finds you guilty of the offence, costs will be imposed in addition to any penalty.

- 6 If you admit liability for the offence but want the court to consider your submissions as to penalty or otherwise, you should in your letter to the enforcement authority—
- (a) request a hearing; and
  - (b) admit liability; and

- (c) set out the written submissions you wish to be considered by the court. The enforcement authority will then file your letter with the court (unless it decides not to commence court proceedings in respect of the offence). There is no provision for an oral hearing before the court if you follow this course of action.

**Note:** Costs will be imposed in addition to any penalty.

- 7 If you do not pay the infringement fee and do not request a hearing in respect of an alleged offence within 28 days after the service on you of this notice, you will (unless the enforcement authority decides otherwise) be served with a reminder notice.
- 8 If you do not pay the infringement fee and do not request a hearing in respect of the alleged offence within 28 days after being served with the reminder notice, you will become liable to pay costs in addition to the infringement fee, unless the enforcement authority decides not to commence proceedings against you.
- 9 When writing or making payment of an infringement fee, please indicate—
  - (a) the date of the infringement offence; and
  - (b) the infringement notice number; and
  - (c) the identifying number of each alleged offence and the course of action you are taking in respect of it (if this notice sets out more than 1 offence and you are not paying all the infringement fees for all the alleged offences); and
  - (d) your full address for replies (if you are not paying all the infringement fees for all the alleged offences).

If it is not clear which alleged offence any payment relates to, your payment may be treated as relating to the alleged offences in the order in which they are set out on the front page of this notice.

- (b) by immediate payment (if you were served with this notice at a port that has been approved under the Biosecurity Act 1993 for an offence on an international flight).

**Note:** Late payment, or payment at any other address, will not be a defence.

### *Right to request hearing*

You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, be signed by you, and be delivered to the address specified on the front of this notice before, or within 14 days after, you have been served with this notice.

If you request a hearing, you may deny liability for the offence, or admit liability and make submissions as to penalty or any other matter.

If you deny liability for the offence, the enforcement authority will serve you with a notice of hearing setting out the place and time at which the matter will be heard by the court (unless the enforcement authority decides not to start court proceedings).

**Note:** If the court finds you guilty of the offence, costs will be imposed in addition to any fine.

If you admit liability for the offence but want the court to consider your submissions, you should, in your request for a hearing,—

- (a) admit the offence; and
- (b) set out the written submissions you wish to be considered by the court.

The enforcement authority will then file your letter with the court (unless the enforcement authority decides not to commence court proceedings). There will be no oral hearing before the court if you follow this course of action.

**Note:** Costs will be imposed in addition to any fine.

*Consequences of taking no action*

If, within 14 days after being served with this notice, you have not paid the infringement fee and the enforcement authority has not received a request for a hearing, you will become liable to pay costs in addition to the infringement fee (unless the enforcement authority decides not to commence court proceedings against you).

*Questions and other correspondence*

- \*9 behaved in a threatening, offensive, insulting or disorderly manner in breach of section 65K(1)(a) of the Civil Aviation Act 1990:
- \*10 used threatening, offensive, or insulting words in breach of section 65K(1)(b) of the Civil Aviation Act 1990:
- \*11 used a portable electronic device in breach of section 65L of the Civil Aviation Act 1990:
- \*12 failed to comply with instructions of a crew member, passenger information signs, or placards to occupy a seat or berth and fasten, and keep fastened, any

installed safety belt or safety harness in breach of section 65M of the Civil Aviation Act 1990:

- \*13 smoked or vaped on board the flight when instructed not to do so in breach of section 65N of the Civil Aviation Act 1990:
- \*14 carried or caused to be carried dangerous goods on the aircraft in breach of section 65O of the Civil Aviation Act 1990:
