Pursuant to section 21(2) of the New Zealand Council for Educational Research Act 1972, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Education who, after consulting with the New Zealand Council for Educational Research, is satisfied of the matters set out in section 21(2A) of that Act, makes the following order.

Order

1 Title

This order is the New Zealand Council for Educational Research (Electoral College) Order 2009.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3 People entitled to have their names enrolled on roll of electoral college

- (1) The people listed in the Schedule are entitled to have their names enrolled on the roll of the electoral college.
- (2) To avoid doubt, a reference in the Schedule to a body that changes its name is to be read as a reference to that body under its name for the time being.
