1 Title

This order is the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Blackcurrants) Amendment Order 2010.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3 Principal order amended

This order amends the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Blackcurrants) Order 1990.

4 Recognised product group

Clause 5 is amended by omitting “Blackcurrants N.Z. Ltd.” and substituting “Blackcurrants New Zealand Incorporated”.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order (which comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*) amends the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Blackcurrants) Order 1990 by substituting a new entity Blackcurrants New Zealand Incorporated as the recognised product group for blackcurrants under the New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority Act 1987. This amendment follows the merger of the previous recognised product group with another entity to form Blackcurrants New Zealand Incorporated.
