This order is the Medicines (Deferral of Expiry of Part 7A) Order 2011.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 22 September 2011.

3 Expiry of Part

This order specifies the date “30 September 2016” in substitution for the date specified in section 96J(1) of the Medicines Act 1981.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 22 September 2011, defers the expiry of Part 7A of the Medicines Act 1981 by 5 years (until the close of 30 September 2016). Part 7A imposes restrictions on xenotransplantation.
