## Order

### 1 Title

This order is the Medicines (Deferral of Expiry of Part 7A) Order 2011.

### 2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 22 September 2011.

### 3 Expiry of Part

This order specifies the date “30 September 2016” in substitution for the date specified in section 96J(1) of the Medicines Act 1981.

### 4 Revocations

The following orders are revoked:

- (a) Medicines (Deferral of Expiry of Part 7A) Order 2003 (SR 2003/132);
- (b) Medicines (Deferral of Expiry of Part 7A) Order 2008 (SR 2008/313).

## Explanatory note

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order, which comes into force on 22 September 2011, defers the expiry of Part 7A of the Medicines Act 1981 by 5 years (until the close of 30 September 2016). Part 7A imposes restrictions on xenotransplantation.
