1 Title

These rules are the Court of Appeal (List Election Petitions) Amendment Rules 2012.

2 Commencement

These rules come into force on 4 February 2013.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These rules, which come into force on 4 February 2013, amend the Court of Appeal (List Election Petitions) Rules 1998 (the **principal rules**) by updating cross-references to certain rules in Part 7 of the High Court Rules. The cross-references appear in rule 4 of the principal rules, and this amendment aligns the cross-references with changes made by the High Court Amendment Rules (No 2) 2012.
