Regulations

1 Title

These regulations are the District Courts Fees Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2013.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 16 September 2013.

3 Principal regulations

These regulations amend the District Courts Fees Regulations 2009 (the **principal regulations**).

4 Regulation 4 amended (Fees of court)

After regulation 4(2), insert:

- "(3) Despite regulation 4A, no hearing or scheduling fee may be charged for—
 - "(a) a hearing that—
 - "(i) is not opposed by the respondent; and
 - "(ii) takes place in a list sitting:
 - "(b) any portion of a hearing that takes place in a list sitting if the hearing—
 - "(i) is opposed by the respondent; and
 - "(ii) is adjourned to a specified date and time.
- "(4) For the purposes of determining the hearing or scheduling fee for a hearing specified in subclause (3)(b), the first day or first half-day of the hearing is the day or half-day of the date specified in the adjournment.
- "(5) In subclause (3), **list sitting** means a sitting in which different applications are sequentially called before a Judge or a Registrar of a District Court."

5 Schedule amended

In the Schedule, replace item 10(b) with:

- (b) in the case of an appeal to the District no fee Court
- (c) in the case of a limited licence application under section 103 of the Land
 Transport Act 1998
- (d) in any other case 900

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 16 September 2013, amend the District Courts Fees Regulations 2009 to ensure that the appropriate fees (if any) are incurred for applications that are heard in a list sitting.
