Order

1 Title

This order is the Medicines (Deferral of Expiry of Part 7A) Order 2016.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 29 September 2016.

3 Section 96J(1) of Medicines Act 1981 amended

In section 96J(1) of the Medicines Act 1981, replace “30 September 2016” with “30 September 2020”.

4 Revocation

The Medicines (Deferral of Expiry of Part 7A) Order 2011 (SR 2011/283) is revoked.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 29 September 2016, defers the expiry of Part 7A of the Medicines Act 1981 to 30 September 2020. Part 7A imposes restrictions on xenotransplantation.
