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### **Order**

#### **1 Title**

This order is the Imports and Exports (Restrictions) Prohibition Order (No 2) 2004 Amendment Order 2020.

#### **2 Commencement**

This order comes into force on 3 December 2020.

**3 Principal order**

This order amends the Imports and Exports (Restrictions) Prohibition Order (No 2) 2004 (the **principal order**).

**4 Schedule 1 amended**

In Schedule 1, insert in their appropriate alphabetical order:

Dicofol

Perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA; CAS No: 335-67-1), including any of its branched isomers, its salts, and PFOA-related compounds, which include any substances having a linear or branched perfluoroheptyl group with moiety  $(C_7F_{15})C$  as one of the structural elements

**Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order, which comes into force on 3 December 2020, amends the Imports and Exports (Restrictions) Prohibition Order (No 2) 2004 to include 2 further chemicals in the list of Stockholm chemicals in Schedule 1 of that order.
