Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 July 2022, inserts the name of the Ministry for Disabled People into Part 1A of Schedule 1 of the Ombudsmen Act 1975. The Ministry for Disabled People is a new departmental agency to which the Public Service Act 2020 applies (*see* the Public Service (Ministry for Disabled People) Order 2022).

The effect of this order is that both the Ombudsmen Act 1975 and the Official Information Act 1982 apply to the Ministry for Disabled People.
