Civil Aviation (Offences) Regulations 2025 (SL 2025/25)

These regulations are made under section 407 of the Civil Aviation Act 2023—

- (a) on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council; and
- (b) on the recommendation of the Minister of Transport.

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Note

The Parliamentary Counsel Office has made editorial and format changes to this version using the powers under subpart 2 of Part 3 of the Legislation Act 2019.

These regulations are administered by the Ministry of Transport.

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Regulations

1 Title

These regulations are the Civil Aviation (Offences) Regulations 2025.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 5 April 2025.

3 Interpretation

- (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

Act means the Civil Aviation Act 2023

Civil Aviation Rules or **rules** means the rules made under Part 3 of the Act.

- (2) A reference in these regulations to any provision of the rules includes a provision for the time being in force amending or replacing that provision.
- (3) The brief descriptions given in the second column of Schedules 2 and 3 are intended to be only an indication of the content of the provisions of the rules they describe, and are not intended to be used in the interpretation of the provisions.
- (4) Abbreviations used in the second column of Schedules 2 and 3 have the meanings given to those abbreviations in the rules.

4 Transitional, savings, and related provisions

The transitional, savings, and related provisions (if any) set out in Schedule 1 have effect according to their terms.

5 Offences and penalties

- (1) A breach of a provision of the rules specified in the first column of Schedule 2 is an offence against the Act.
- (2) A person who commits an offence referred to in subclause (1) is liable on conviction,—
 - (a) in the case of an individual, to a fine not exceeding the amount specified in relation to that offence in the third column of Schedule 2:
 - (b) in the case of any other person, to a fine not exceeding the amount specified in relation to that offence in the fourth column of Schedule 2.

6 Infringement offences

- (1) A breach of a provision of the rules specified in the first column of Schedule 3 is an infringement offence against the Act.
- (2) The infringement fee for an offence referred to in subclause (1) is,—
 - (a) in the case of an individual, the infringement fee specified in relation to that offence in the fifth column of Schedule 3:
 - (b) in the case of any other person, the infringement fee specified in relation to that offence in the sixth column of Schedule 3.
- (3) The maximum fine that can be imposed by a court for an offence referred to in subclause (1) is,—
 - (a) in the case of an individual, the fine specified in relation to that offence in the third column of Schedule 3:
 - (b) in the case of any other person, the fine specified in relation to that offence in the fourth column of Schedule 3.

7 Infringement notices

- (1) An infringement notice issued under section 373 in respect of an unruly passenger offence that is an infringement offence must be in the form set out in Schedule 4.
- (2) An infringement notice issued under section 373 in respect of any other infringement offence must be in the form set out in Schedule 5.

8 Reminder notice

The reminder notice for the purpose of section 378 of the Act must be in the form set out in Schedule 6.

9 Form of pilot-in-command request and undertaking

A form of request and undertaking referred to in section 392(4) of the Act is set out in Schedule 7.
